

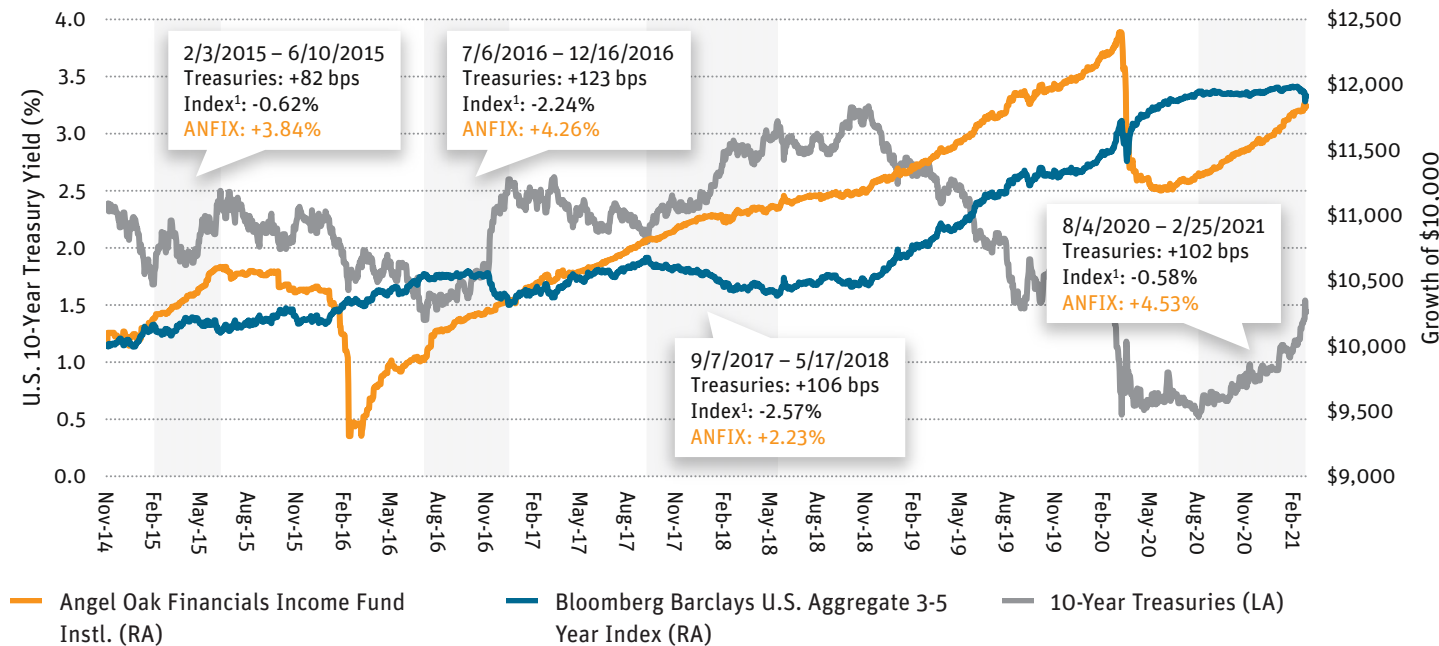
Returns in Periods of Rising Rates

Interest rates have been moving higher as the fear of future inflation has increased. Pent up consumer demand caused by the pandemic, along with the ongoing rollout of the vaccine and continued fiscal and monetary stimulus, has also led to potentially stronger than expected U.S. economic growth. While rising rates could significantly impact much of the traditional fixed income market with the erosion of principal, ANFIX is well-positioned to potentially outperform in a rising rate environment.

Why the Financials Income Fund makes sense in today's environment:

- **Low duration:** Well-positioned for rising rate environment: 2.4 (ANFIX) vs. 3.3 (Index).
- **High current income:** I Shares Distribution Yield of 4.33% and a subsidized SEC yield of 4.04% as of 2/28/21.
- **Correlation:** Daily correlation of 0.1 to the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate 3-5 Year Index since inception.
- **Financials focused:** More than 95% in financial sector debt with a focus on community bank debt.
- **Investment grade:** 90% of the Fund is approximately rated BBB or higher.

Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index: An unmanaged index that measures the performance of the investment-grade universe of bonds issued in the United States. The index includes institutionally traded U.S. Treasury, government sponsored, mortgage and corporate securities.

Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate 3-5 Year Index: An index that tracks bonds with 3-5 year maturities within the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index.

Basis Point (bps): A unit equal to one hundredth of a percentage point.

Correlation: A statistical measure of how two securities move in relation to another. Index used for comparison is the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate 3-5 Year Index.

Effective Duration: Measures a portfolio's sensitivity to changes in interest rates. Generally, the longer the effective duration, the greater the price change relative to interest rate movements.

Sharpe Ratio: A statistical measure that uses standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. A higher Sharpe ratio implies a better historical risk-adjusted performance. The Sharpe ratio has been calculated since inception using the 3-month Treasury bill for the risk-free rate of return.

Standard Deviation: A statistical measure of portfolio risk used to measure variability of total return around an average, over a specified period of time. The greater the standard deviation over the period, the wider the variability or range of returns and hence, the greater the fund's volatility—calculated since inception.
